

## SCIENTIFIC LIBRARY SERVICES



### PDA CLASS INTEREST

The Scientific Library staff is considering offering a class in the use of PDAs, but first we would like to know if the NCI-Frederick community is interested in learning how to use them. PDAs are Portable Digital Assistants, sometimes referred to as PalmPilots. We can provide a trainer who offers free, basic, hands-on instruction on how to operate a PDA. The trainer provides PDAs for hands-on practice, or students may bring their own PDAs to the class. If there is sufficient interest from the NCI-Frederick community, we will try to schedule a definite date in the next few months.

### VIDEO-BASED TRAINING

As part of our training services, the Scientific Library offers Video-Based Training. These courses provide training in a variety of software programs. They offer an alternative to structured classes for those people who prefer a different learning environment and a flexible schedule. They are also useful for those people who have already taken formal classroom-based courses and now desire refreshers.

**Video-Based Training** involves a person interacting with a computer, guided by a videocassette, to learn a software program. The Library provides the computer, the instructional software, the TV/VCR combo, and the room. You provide the time and the effort needed to learn a new software program.

The Scientific Library provides information resources and services to all contractor and NCI intramural personnel working at the NCI-Frederick. In general, it assists in all phases of the research process, providing: background research information needed prior to initiating a project; current awareness services; data for evaluation and comparison in monitoring other similar research projects conducted elsewhere; and support for dissemination of research results, preparing for publication.

Collection Scope: The Scientific Library maintains a variety of materials that address biology, chemistry, microbiology, virology, molecular biology, botany, mathematics, computer science, library science, and an assortment of other related topics. Its collection consists of approximately 12,000 books, 700 journals and serial publications, various audiovisual titles including training materials, and a large selection of abstracting and indexing tools, in print and electronic form.

#### Regular Events:

- Monthly orientation, second Wednesday of each month, or by request.
- Monthly publication of Accessions List/Newsletter outlining news and newly received items.
- Biennial publication of Serials Holding List, listing all journals and serials.
- Annual Open House for National Library Week (April) – tours, free searches, demos.

Basic Services: There are information sheets available at the Circulation Desk to describe in more detail each of the specific services provided by the Library. In summary, we provide: circulation of books; interlibrary loan for obtaining research-related materials not owned in the NCI-Frederick collection; photocopy support – with certain limits based upon copyright laws and staff availability; and reference on demand, both direct look-ups and mediated online searches, provided advance approval is given by the program's fiscal officer.

Reference: Current awareness services include preparation of bibliographies on any subject, either on an incidental basis or repetitively on a regular schedule. One of the more frequent requests we fulfill is to provide a listing of retrospective publications by a given author. Editorial assistance is provided to those who are preparing manuscripts for publication of their research

results. Through computer terminals, the Library has remote access to over 200 online databases containing facts, bibliographic citations, and the full text of selected titles. In addition to providing computer searches and continued updates on demand, the Library offers consultation to those scientists wishing to access databases on their own.

Bibliographic Instruction: The Library offers a wide range of instructional programs, designed to help library users get the most out of library resources. Subject-oriented workshops are designed to facilitate access to the literature of particular research areas. Participants will learn how to use the catalog, selected print index and abstract publications, and other reference materials in sessions tailored to their specific field of interest. Online databases may also be demonstrated.

Taught by Library staff, database searching and software demos are held in the Library's Microcomputer Lab. Participants learn how to search the databases most commonly used at the Center. Past classes have included instruction on the World Wide Web, PubMed, EndNote and Chemical Abstracts, Reference Manager, and Web of Science.

Individualized Video-Based Training: The Library offers a number of VCR/software programs to assist those who prefer a self-paced approach to learning software programs. Video-based training involves a person interacting with a computer, guided by a videocassette, to learn a software program. The Library provides the computer, the instructional software, the TV/VCR combo, the videocassette, the headphones, and the room. Users provide the time and the effort needed to learn a new software program. The programs require approximately 4-8 hours of interaction, which can be broken into a number of modules and spread over a number of days.

Publications: Once a month, a list of new books, journals, and audiovisual materials is circulated to General Distribution. This list is contained in the Scientific Library's monthly newsletter which also includes brief notes highlighting new reference materials, services, Internet sites and special events sponsored by the Library. Although the most up-to-date information concerning the over 700 journal and monographic serial subscriptions maintained in our collections may be obtained by searching our online catalog, we also provide a printed Serial Holdings list for the benefit of those who do not have immediate access to a microcomputer. Updated every other year, this printed list summarizes all journal titles owned. In

addition, the Library has a home page on the World Wide Web which provides information about the Library and its services, a link to the Library's online catalog, the current issue of the Library's monthly Newsletter, and links to NIH and other area libraries and Web sites of interest. New Employee Orientation: A representative of the Library staff addresses new employees on the second Wednesday of each month, at 2:30 p.m. All new employees are sent a personal invitation to these programs, and receive a packet of information concerning all library services when they attend.

Tours: These are given on an informal, walk-in basis to individuals, or by appointment to groups. Some labs may wish to schedule a special session for a group of new employees, perhaps tailored to their particular field of interest; this can easily be arranged. The Library is right across the hall from the conference center auditorium and the cafeteria, and therefore an easy detour for those attending programs or having lunch. Tours include a brief description of services and policies, location of special collections, use of self-service photocopy and microfilm equipment, and an introduction to CD-ROM reference tools.

Consumer Health Information: CHI, a collaborative project sponsored by the Scientific Library, Occupational Health Services, and the Employee Assistance Program, is located in the Reference area of the Library. The collection contains a variety of circulating books, audiovisual materials, and free pamphlets for the use of NCI-Frederick personnel in understanding health problems or improving their health in general.

Microcomputer Lab: The Library houses a Microcomputer Lab for training purposes. The facility seats up to 10 people, and is used primarily by Library staff to teach scheduled database training demos for Center employees. Software classes offered by DMS Computer & Statistical Services throughout the year, and training classes by other programs, are also held in the Microcomputer Lab.



## NEW METHOD FOR OFF-SITE ACCESS IS HERE!

The Library is pleased to announce a new way for NCI-Frederick employees to access site-restricted online resources from off-site. If you use a third party Internet Service Provider (e.g. AOL, Earthlink) via DSL, cable, ISDN, or regular modem, you may click on the "Off-Site Access" link from the main page of the Library's Web site. First, however, be sure that you have registered with the Library to obtain a patron barcode. The barcode will be located on the back of your NCI-Frederick employee ID card. Then, from off-site, once you have clicked on the "Off-Site Access" link, you will be asked to read and accept the Terms of Use, type in your barcode number, and type in your last name. If your information is validated, you will be instructed to proceed to the Main Page via the off-site access interface.

### **Remember!**

- This service is restricted to NCI-Frederick employees.
- You must have a barcode on the back of your NCI-Frederick employee ID.
- You must be OFF-SITE to use this service, (OR in a building connected to the NIH server).
- Earlier versions (before 4.0) of Netscape or Internet Explorer are not recommended.

## RETRACTIONS OF PUBLICATIONS

The staff of the Scientific Library provides this service to alert our readers to any journal articles that are being retracted by the authors. Often, research that is undertaken to support the ideas in journal articles is questioned by other scientists. If the original authors then publish a formal retraction of all or parts of the original article, MEDLINE indexes that new article as “RETRACTION OF PUBLICATION” in the “publications type” field.

When a new retraction appears in MEDLINE, and subsequently in our newsletter, staff members type alerts that are permanently attached to the original articles. In this way, if a scientist is reading the original article, he/she will immediately be aware of the published retraction, and will be able to easily locate it in the journal collection.
