
WORLD AIDS DAY - 25th Anniversary

December 1 of every year is designated World AIDS Day. This year is the 25th anniversary of the discovery of AIDS. The staff of the Scientific Library plans to observe this anniversary by presenting a **SCIENCE IN THE CINEMA** in December. On Monday, December 4, and Tuesday, December 5, we will show the movie **AND THE BAND PLAYED ON**. This 1993 movie offers a historical look at AIDS, from the early days in

1978 when people began dying from a mysterious illness, to the identification of the HIV virus. The movie, which is rated PG-13 with a running time of 140 minutes, will begin at 1:00 pm each day.

Then, on Tuesday, December 12, **Dr. Larry Arthur**, Head of the Retroviral Vaccine Section of the AIDS Vaccine Program, will present an informative talk about AIDS research and the participation of NCI-Frederick in

that research. We encourage everyone to plan now to attend this very timely and important program.

Was it the genuine imitation hundred dollar bills that attracted so many NCI employees to participate in this year's Book Swap? The connection to the Library's month long celebration of the 300th anniversary of Ben Franklin's birth is what prompted the monetary advertisement.

Library staff enthusiastically collected and spent hours sorting donated books, DVDs, CDs, and cassettes to prepare for the opening day. At ten minutes until ten o'clock the crowd of employees had gathered and filled the

lobby of Building 549 in anticipation of the start of the 7th Annual event. A countdown ten seconds prior to the release brought further excitement.

The largest number of titles that were received fell in the category of Mystery / Thriller, but it was the Science Fiction / Fantasy titles that disappeared the fastest.

The Scientific Library hosts the Swap annually to coincide with National Medical Librarians Month in October. It serves to bring aware-

ness to all of the Library services, but to the Center for Health Information in particular. Employees are encouraged to come and browse the selection of pamphlets, books and media related to personal health issues and disease prevention.

A diverse group of employees participate in the Swap which is open to the entire NCI Frederick / Fort Detrick community.

After the initial day, the books and media are relocated for display in the Scientific Library for the month of November,

so that people have time to make their final selections. Eventually, anyone, whether or not they have donated, may choose from the remaining materials. Finally, all of the books and media that remain are donated to a local charitable organization. The Book Swap has always been very successful in the past and continues to retain its popularity. New! Nature Protocols

Nature Protocols, from Nature Publishing Group, is an interactive online resource for laboratory protocols which provides step-by-step descriptions of procedures that users can take to the lab bench and immediately apply in their own research. Protocols on the site are fully searchable and organized into categories for easy accessibility to researchers.

Protocols come from a variety of sources and include high quality, peer-reviewed procedures commissioned by the **Nature Protocols** editorial team as well as protocols derived from supplementary information from Nature Research Journals. Future enhancements include supplier protocols and content posted directly on the site by the scientific community using social software. Inside Cancer

Created at the Dolan DNA Learning Center of the Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, the Inside Cancer site is a remarkable exploration of the nature of cancer in the human body. Utilizing graphics and interactive animations, the site is divided into sections that deal with the causes and prevention of cancer, its diagnosis and treatment, and how the disease manifests itself. Each section combines animations with video clips of scientists narrating brief passages that illuminate the accompanying descriptions and captions. Visitors will learn about current ways that cancer can be treated, and future directions for cancer research.

New Web of Knowledge Interface Launched

NIH's Center for Information Technology (CIT) recently updated the interface for **Web of Knowledge** which encompasses **Web of Science**, **PORPOISE**, and **Journal Citation Reports**. The links have been updated on the Library's web site. Please be sure to update your bookmarks and personal links to the **Web of Knowledge** database. The new URL is <http://portalwok3.cit.nih.gov/portal.cgi>.

Changes to the updated interface include:

- Number of retrieved results displays at the top of the page (instead of the bottom)
- Capability to sort up to 100,000 records
- Ability to search within results to narrow retrieval
- Advanced search features allow for combining sets
- Analyze results using rank field values to discover research trends

New to **PORPOISE**, the research alerts service is the ability to set up cited reference search results.

Please remember that when using features of the **Web of Knowledge**, **cookies must be turned on**. If you wish assistance or further information about changes to the interface, please contact the Library at library@mail.ncifcrf.gov. Don't forget that we offer scheduled group classes, customized training to fit your needs and time, or one-on-one instruction at your convenience.
