The DVDs will feature Dr. Loretta LaRoche, a nationally recognized speaker on stress management. Dr. Butt will keep you laughing as he tells stories from his personal and professional lives. Following Dr. Butt’s talk, the Library will host a book sale and signing for the speaker’s book **Saturday Mornings**. Specific dates and movie titles will be announced soon. Book Swap Set for November 9

It’s no joke! The Library will soon be celebrating National Medical Librarian’s Month by hosting their 8th Annual Book Swap. This year it will also be held in conjunction with the upcoming **REWARDS** Program focusing on Laughter. Mark your calendars for Friday, November 9th when the Swap will take place in the Lobby of the Conference Center in Building 549. Participation is open to the whole Fort Detrick community.

Starting October 1 the Library will collect not only books, but also videos, records, tapes, CDs and DVDs that are in good condition for the Swap. This is an item-for-item exchange, so for each individual item that you donate you will be credited for an item that you would like to select. Magazines are accepted as giveaways, but they do not earn any credits. All donations will be accepted until November 7.

On November 9, the materials will be displayed in the Lobby of the Conference Center. Then beginning at 10:00 am, anyone who has received a credit can browse the items, make selections, and redeem their credits. All items are on a first-come, first-served basis. After 3:00 pm, the materials will be moved to the Scientific Library where they will remain until the end of November, so that anyone with remaining credits can browse and make selections at their leisure. Any leftover books or audiovisuals will be donated to charity, or shared with other libraries via the Backmed listserv.

- o ETHICAL AND REGULATORY ASPECTS OF CLINICAL RESEARCH will be shown weekly in the Scientific Library Technology Training Lab on Wednesday mornings from 8:30a.m. to 11:30a.m. on September 26, 2007 through November 14, 2007. Registration ends September 14, 2007.
- o INTRODUCTION TO THE PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF CLINICAL RESEARCH (IPPCR) will be shown on Monday and Tuesday evenings on October 15, 2007 through February 25, 2008 from 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. in Conference Room B of the Conference Center in Building 549. Registration ends October 4, 2007.
- o PRINCIPLES OF CLINICAL PHARMACOLOGY (registration closed August 23) will be shown weekly in Conference Room B of the Conference Center in Building 549 on Thursday evenings, 6:30 p.m. to 7:45 p.m., from September 6, 2007 through April 24, 2008.

All classes will be posted on the Internet for later viewing, if you are not able to watch them live. Registration is required to view the current IPCCR classes, but the other two courses can be viewed without registration. You may purchase the books at various bookstores and online resources at a cost of approximately \$40-\$100 each. The Scientific Library has a copy available of each title for use within the Library only. These books may not be borrowed.

You can either renew selected items by placing a check in the box next to items on the list and clicking on “Renew Selected Items,” OR click on “Renew All” to renew everything you have checked out.

If your renewal is successful, a new due date will be displayed in the “STATUS” column. Otherwise, a message of “RENEW NOT ALLOWED” will appear on the screen. Always check the STATUS column for information on the success or failure of your renewal.
