RISKS OF PUBLISHING SENSITIVE INFORMATION

Recently, the education weekly, **Chronicle of Higher Education**, published articles relating to the impact of the fight against terrorism on publication of scientific research. Under discussion by White House officials are guidelines to limit publication of some federal research and other government-owned data that are defined as "sensitive homeland security information," or "sensitive but unclassified." This new type of information could include information useful to terrorists in conventional or biological warfare and would not be available to the public. Sensitive information could include scientific data collected at NIH or a federal government national laboratory. Unresolved was whether the policy would apply to collaborations between a federal and a university researcher.

The issue of great concern to publishers of research articles and scholarly societies and searchers is how to balance the possibility of providing information in research papers that might help terrorists, with providing the research community the information it needs to further scientific discovery. There is also fear that these concerns will impact future research since pertinent pieces of information in articles may be left out. Another scenario is to leave it to publishers themselves to manage the access to information, keeping sensitive material out of open literature and allowing only certain people to view it.

If you wish to read more on this topic, the Library holds the most recent year of the **Chronicle of Higher Education** in the collection. An online version is also available to NCI-Frederick employees, but requires a password.

NCBI INSTRUCTIONAL CLASS



RETRACTIONS OF PUBLICATIONS

The staff of the Scientific Library provides this service to alert our readers to any journal articles that are being retracted by the authors. Often, research that is undertaken to support the ideas in journal articles is questioned by other scientists. If the original authors then publish a formal retraction of all or parts of the original article, MEDLINE indexes that new article as “RETRACTION OF PUBLICATION” in the “publications type” field.

When a new retraction appears in MEDLINE, and subsequently in our newsletter, staff members type alerts that are permanently attached to the original articles. In this way, if a scientist is reading the original article, he/she will immediately be aware of the published retraction, and will be able to easily locate it in the journal collection.
