Books By Mail

Several NCI-Frederick contractor and government offices are located off-site, in such locations as Trail Avenue, Fairview Center, and Thomas Johnson Drive. We recognize that coming on campus just to pick up a library book is not always quick or convenient, and although Library staff certainly enjoy seeing patrons in person, we know how valuable their time is. So after careful consideration, the decision has been made that all circulating items owned by the Scientific Library, such as books, audiovisuals, etc., may be delivered through campus mail upon request. This service will be limited to those employees who are located off-site, outside Fort Detrick, strictly as a courtesy. (Items borrowed on interlibrary loan and items purchased with project funds cannot be delivered and must continue to be picked up in person.) If borrowers choose to return materials through the campus mail, the Library cannot be held responsible for them should they be lost or damaged in transit. Borrowers will be notified by e-mail when an item has been sent to them via campus mail. Before mailing, the items will be checked out to the borrower's account, and the item will be stamped with the due date. We kindly request that borrowers reply to the e-mail to let us know that the items has arrived safely at their office. To avoid inadvertent misplacement, special colored envelopes have been ordered to designate these deliveries; we ask that use of these be limited to this specific purpose and that all such envelopes be returned to the Library when no longer needed.

STUDENT ORIENTATIONS

If you are a high school or college student working at the NCI-Frederick campus, you will probably visit the Scientific Library in Building 549 sometime during your workweek. You may be asked to photocopy journal articles. You may be asked to perform a computer search to find journal articles on a particular topic. You may want to learn how to use some computer software. Or you may just be looking for a quiet place to read and study.

To help you get started, the Scientific Library will be offering Student Orientations in June and July. A Student Orientation provides a tour of the Library, instructions on searching the Online Catalog, demonstration of and practice with the Library's web site, and guidance in locating journal articles to photocopy.

Four identical sessions are scheduled on different days at different times to accommodate a variety of schedules. Each Student Orientation is approximately 1 hour in length. Due to space limitations in the Microcomputer Lab, students must PRE-REGISTER for a Student Orientation. To register, please follow these steps:

1. Read the Student Orientation schedule listed below.
2. Choose a day and time that suit your schedule.
3. Call extension 5840, or stop in the Library, Bldg. 549, to register.

CHANGES IN PUBMED

PubMed is instituting changes to the Entrez software that runs the PubMed system. These changes, which will be completed by June 2003, may affect PubMed users who have saved search strategies using a browser URL, and PubMed users who also use bibliographic management software programs such as EndNote or Reference Manager.

If you encounter problems connecting to PubMed using EndNote or Reference Manager, the National Library of Medicine suggests that you contact product support for those programs.

If you have any PubMed search strategies saved with browser URLs via the "Details" screen within PubMed, those saved URLs may not work with the newly instituted changes. A better option for saving search strategies is available via the PubMed Cubby. The Cubby allows you to store search strategies and then run them whenever you wish. Each time a Cubby stored search is run, the results are limited to those citations that were added to the database since the last time the search was run. In this way you will only receive new citations. Borrower's Advisory

The Scientific Library is reviewing its Policies & Procedures, and in the process has identified one which all employees should be reminded of periodically. This is NCI-F P&P #110.1, entitled **Library Services**. This policy addresses the responsibilities of WISCO as the Scientific Library Contractor, those of other NCI-F Contractors and Government staff, and those of Borrowers. We'd like to take this opportunity to restate the section which pertains to Borrowers:

Borrowers assume total responsibility for any material borrowed from the Library, being held personally accountable for its loss or damage. Should a book be damaged or lost when it is checked out of the Scientific Library as either a regular or extended loan, it is the responsibility of the borrower or their designated representative who picks up the book for them to reimburse the Scientific Library for its replacement cost. The borrower's signature on the book card serves as acceptance of this responsibility.

While the Library no longer uses book cards for checking out materials, it instead obtains a signature when issuing a barcode to each employee for the first time. The barcode application form contains the reference to P&P #110.1, and specifically states that in the event that the borrower terminates employment at NCI-F and said costs have not been recovered, the funds owed will be withheld from the final paycheck.

Obviously there are times when loss or damage to library materials is outside the control of the borrower, and therefore unavoidable, it is not our desire to penalize those who use our services. Still, because the money used to purchase them comes from the taxpayer, and because the Library's resources must be replaced so that they remain available for all, it is necessary to implement policies that encourage their careful handling and treatment. It is in this spirit that we remind our patrons of this responsibility.



ONLINE RESOURCES UPDATE

ScienceDirect Journals:

Due to exorbitant fees charged by Elsevier Science, complimentary access to many articles from the backfiles of **ScienceDirect** titles which were formerly available, are no longer available to NCI-Frederick users, but are now restricted to Bethesda. You can identify titles which are not included in the NIH Libraries subscription by noting whether there is a **green book (access allowed)** or a **white book (access not allowed)** next to the title. We have noted which years are included in the NIH Libraries subscription next to any ScienceDirect titles on our Online Journals list. Please [let us know](#) if you have any questions or concerns about these or any titles.

Lippincott Williams & Wilkins (LWW) Journals:

Many of the titles published by LWW are now available only via the NIH Ovid interface. This was a change made by the publisher, which offered no option for subscribers. Some good news is that LWW titles published online by HighWire Press are still available via the HighWire interface. This interface is much more user-friendly, faster loading, and not limited to one concurrent user, such as is the case with the LWW titles via Ovid. We have made both options available on our online journals list where applicable, so that you may decide which interface you prefer.

RETRACTIONS OF PUBLICATIONS

The staff of the Scientific Library provides this service to alert our readers to any journal articles that are being retracted by the authors. Often, other scientists question research that is undertaken to support the ideas in journal articles. If the original authors publish a formal retraction of all or parts of the original article, MEDLINE indexes that new article as "RETRACTION OF PUBLICATION" in the "publications type" field.

When a new retraction appears in MEDLINE, and subsequently in our newsletter, staff members type alerts that are permanently attached to the original articles. In this way, if a scientist is reading the original article, he/she will immediately be aware of the published retraction, and will be able to easily locate it in the journal collection.



