## *NCI at Frederick Scientific Publications Database Improved*

Since 1997 the Scientific Library has maintained a database of publications authored by employees of NCI at Frederick. We invite you to take a look at the [recently redesigned database](#), which offers some features that were not available in previous versions. This resource is linked from all of the [Library's webpages](#).

The Scientific Library staff would like to thank Computer & Statistical Services for their assistance redesigning the publications database. Their efforts went above and beyond the expectations of the Library to add many additional improvements to this resource.

The database offers simple and advanced search functions, and you may export your results to EndNote or as an Excel file. Individual records within the database provide links to the full text of the item, as well as records in **PubMed**, **Web of Science**, and **PubMed Central**. Hovering over the colorful Altmetric badge, when available, will display details about attention received by that item in social media, news outlets, and other sources. You may click the link accompanying the badge to access additional limited information from Altmetric. [Platinum Publications](#) are also identified in the individual records.

We want to make sure we have the most complete information possible in this database. If you notice that any of your publications are not included, please [contact the Library](#), so that we may add them. It is especially helpful if you let us know about books, book chapters, and patents, as those may not be included in our regular searches to find NCI at Frederick items. We hope this resource will be useful to you and that you will give us your feedback after you try it.
